

Stamp Set: Whale Done (#152470 \$17) Bundle (#154053 \$31.50)
Cardstock: Pretty Peacock (#150880 \$8.75), Basic White (#159276 \$9.75)
Designer Paper: Whale of a Time (#152460 \$11.50)
Ink: Granny Apple Green (#147095 \$7.50), Pretty Peacock (#150083 \$7.50)
Accessories: Stampin' Dimensionals (#104430 \$4)
Tools: Stampin' Cut & Emboss Machine (#149653 \$120) Layering Circle Dies (#151770 \$35)
Whale Builder Punch (#152699 \$18)

Dimensions: Pretty Peacock: 5 ½" x 8 ½" scored at 4 ¼" Basic White: 5 ¼" x 8" scored at 4" & 6" (fold scored lines in opposite directions), scrap Designer Paper: 5 ¼" x 4", 5 ¼" x 2"

- 1. Fold the Pretty Peacock cardstock in half to form card base.
- 2. Adhere strip of designer paper to middles section of scored Basic White cardstock. If the designer paper has an up/down image on it make sure that the large section of the Basic White cardstock is to the left when adhering the designer paper to the middle section. Also make sure the designer paper doesn't overhang edges.
- 3. Stamp the birthday sentiment on large section of Basic White cardstock with the Granny Apple Green ink.
- 4. Stamp the little school of fish right underneath the sentiment with the Pretty Peacock ink.
- 5. Ink up seaweed stamp in Granny Apple Green. Now kind of roll the edges of the stamp in the Pretty Peacock ink. Stamp image. Repeat if desired. I stamped the seaweed twice on the left and just the top of the image on the right.
- 6. Adhere the large section of the Basic White cardstock to the inside of the card. Make sure the two smaller sections are to the right.
- 7. Adhere the large piece of designer paper to the front of the card. TIP: Only place your adhesive along the edges of the designer paper. This way, when you die cut the window in the front the designer paper won't stick to the cardstock.
- 8. Die cut a circle in the front of the card with the 3rd largest Layering Circle Die. You will end up cutting through both the designer paper and the cardstock. Discard the designer paper circle.
- 9. Stamp the Big Deal sentiment on scrap of Basic White cardstock with the Granny Apple Green ink. Center the 4th largest Layering Circle Die over the sentiment leaving a little more space below the sentiment. This is so you have room for the whale to overlap the circle. Die cut.
- 10. Adhere the sentiment circle to the Pretty Peacock circle that you die cut from the front of the card.

- 11. Close up the card. You should be able to see part of the small outside section of the Basic White cardstock as well as a portion of the inside of the card. With the card closed, place adhesive only on the portion of the small section of the Basic White cardstock. (this is the portion to the right). Now, still with the card closed, adhere the Pretty Peacock/sentiment circle to the adhesive.
- 12. Now when you open the card the sentiment circle will be on the inside of the card. When you look at the front of the card you will have your window.
- 13. One of the patterns of designer paper is whales. Use the Whale Builder Punch to punch out a whale. Place 2-3 Mini Stampin' Dimensionals on the whale belly and tail. Adhere to front of card so whale head overlaps sentiment circle.
